DESCRIPTION/BACKGROUND

The 2017 Road Striping project includes pavement markings on approximately 80 miles of roadway including collectors and urban/rural residential roads as well as traffic controls and environmental protections.

Bids were solicited through area newspapers as well as the city's bids and awards webpage and listserv. The bid opening was held on July 6, 2017, and the apparent low bidder is Apply-A-Line, Inc., in the base bid amount of \$119,999.80. The engineer's estimate is \$121,000.00. See the attached bid form for results.

City staff has reviewed the contractor's qualifications and recommends award to Apply-A-Line, Inc., in the base bid amount of \$119,999.80, as well as inclusion of Alternative No. 1, in the amount of \$16,640.00, to install raised pavement markers on priority roads, for a total of \$136,639.80.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the CONTRACTING AGENCY has caused the Project Manual, Specifications, Drawings, and other contract documents to be prepared for certain Work as described therein, known as the 2017 ROAD STRIPING PROJECT; and

WHEREAS, the CONTRACTOR has offered to perform the proposed Work in accordance with the terms of the Contract Documents including but not limited to this Contract; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties herein contained and to be performed, the CONTRACTOR hereby agrees that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated into this Contract and to complete the Work at the price and on the terms and conditions herein contained. The CONTRACTING AGENCY agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR the contract price of One Hundred Thirty-Six Thousand Six Hundred Thirty-Nine Dollars and 80 cents (\$136,639.80) ("Contract Price") for the fulfillment of the Work and the performance of the covenants set forth herein.

The further terms, conditions, and covenants of this Contract are set forth in the following documents, all of which are component parts of this Contract as if set out in full, and if not attached, as if hereto attached collectively referred to as the "Contract Documents":

- 1. This Contract, including the form "Proposal Items of Work and Materials to be Provided, Estimated Quantities, Units of Measurement at the Unit Bid Prices
- 2. The Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge and Municipal Construction, 2016 edition, as issued by the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) and the American Public Works Association (APWA), Washington State Chapter (hereafter "Standard Specifications")
- 3. Amendments to the Standard Specifications
- 4. Indemnity and Insurance Agreement
- 5. Special Indemnity and Insurance Agreement
- 6. Prevailing Wage Schedules and Regulations
- 7. Specifications, Drawings, Details, and all other Documents contained in and made applicable by this Contract and the Project Manual
- 8. All Plans, Drawings, Specifications, and Addenda issued prior to the Bid Opening Date.

The CONTRACTING AGENCY and the CONTRACTOR recognize that time is of the essence of this Contract and that the CONTRACTING AGENCY will suffer financial loss if the Work is not completed within the time specified in this Contract. Therefore, the parties agree that the liquidated damages provisions of the Standard Specifications as modified herein shall apply and that those provisions have been mutually negotiated.

DESCRIPTION/BACKGROUND

Kitsap County is empowered to provide emergency communications services through a public corporation known as Central Communications (CenCom). In August of 1993, the City of Bainbridge Island and other public agencies within the county entered into Interlocal Agreements with CenCom to provide those services.

In 2017, Kitsap County formed a new public corporation under the Washington State Constitution and the laws of the State of Washington, and particularly those set forth at RCW 35.21.730 through RCW 35.21.759. That corporation is Kitsap 911. The City of Bainbridge Island wishes to enter into a service agreement with Kitsap 911 enabling Kitsap 911 to continue to provide enhanced emergency 911 communication services to the City.

RECOMMENDED ACTION/MOTION

SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION SERVICES

This Agreement ("Agreement") is made between Kitsap 911, a Washington public corporation ("Kitsap 911"), and the City of Bainbridge Island, a Washington municipal corporation ("Customer"), which are the parties to this agreement ("Party" or "Parties").

I. RECITALS

- A. Kitsap 911 is a public corporation organized and existing under the Washington State Constitution and the laws of the State of Washington, and particularly those set forth at RCW 35.21.730 through RCW 35.21.759; and
- B. The City of Bainbridge Island is a Washington municipal corporation organized and existing under the Washington State Constitution and the laws of the State of Washington, and particularly those set forth at Title 35A RCW; and
- C. Kitsap 911 is obligated to enter into this Service Agreement with the Customer pursuant to Section IX of the Kitsap 911 Bylaws; and
- D. The Customer has requested that Kitsap 911 provide enhanced emergency 911 communications services including radio communication, dispatch, teletype service, and telephone calls directed to the Customer and to refer those calls to the Customer by radio or other appropriate means; and
- E. Kitsap 911 is willing to provide the requested enhanced emergency 911 communication services including radio communication, dispatch, and teletype services and handle telephone calls as necessary and refer those to the Customer by radio or other appropriate means; and
- F. The Customer desires to engage the services of Kitsap 911 to provide such services; and
- G. The Customer and Kitsap 911 recognize the mutual benefit of utilizing Kitsap 911's dispatching services to meet the Customer's dispatching requirements and needs; and
- H. The Customer will pay Kitsap 911 a fee based on the Service Fee Formula set forth in Exhibit IX of the Kitsap 911 Bylaws as more specifically set forth in Attachment A attached hereto and incorporated herein, to have Kitsap 911 provide such services to the Customer.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and in consideration of the promises, terms, and conditions set forth below, it is hereby agreed as follows:

II. AGREEMENT

- A. Communications Services. During the term of this Agreement, Kitsap 911 will provide the Customer twenty-four (24) hour enhanced emergency 911 communications including call receiving, monitoring, and emergency dispatching service for the Customer's citizens, visitors, and responders. Kitsap 911 shall be the primary public safety answering point for the Customer. Kitsap 911 shall ensure that all Federal Communications Commission (FCC) radio frequency licenses include authorization so that the Customer can use Kitsap 911's primary dispatch channels.
- B. <u>Technical Assistance</u>. Kitsap 911 may provide technical expertise to the Customer as may be required for the proper operation of the Customer's systems and for procurement of the Customer's communications equipment.
- C. <u>Law Enforcement Agency Data Communications</u>. If the Customer is a law enforcement agency, Kitsap 911 will provide information from the Washington State Patrol Law Enforcement Data Communications System.
- D. <u>Customer Communications Equipment.</u> Unless otherwise agreed to by the Parties, Kitsap 911 agrees to be responsible for providing and maintaining all communications equipment necessary to receive radio communications from Kitsap 911, and for communicating with Kitsap 911 and between the Customer's personnel. The Customer shall be responsible for purchasing, maintaining, and repairing the Customer's base, mobile, and portable communications equipment including pagers and computers. The Customer shall retain the responsibility and authority for its operational departments and for such equipment and services as required at its place of operations to connect to Kitsap 911's operations. Interconnecting equipment may or may not be included in Kitsap 911's budget as Kitsap 911's Board of Directors shall determine. However, if interconnecting equipment is included in the Kitsap 911 budget and provided to the Customer, Kitsap 911 shall retain ownership of such equipment.
- E. <u>Operational Procedures.</u> All operational procedures shall be determined and established by the Strategic Advisory Board (SAB) pursuant to Section VIII of the Kitsap 911 bylaws. Any disagreements regarding operational procedures that cannot be resolved by the SAB shall be sent for final determination to the Kitsap 911 Board.
- F. <u>Billing and Non-Payment.</u> The Customer shall be billed in accordance with Attachment A for the upcoming calendar year. Unless otherwise agreed to by the Parties, the Customer shall make twelve equal monthly payments, which shall be due by the end of each month. Should Customer fall two (2) months in arrears, the Customer shall be considered delinquent, and in that event, and after providing the required notice and opportunity to cure as set forth in

Section O of this Agreement, Kitsap 911 shall have authority to terminate all services to the Customer and all participation of the Customer to the functions of Kitsap 911. However, the Customer shall be liable for its fees to Kitsap 911 through December 31 of the year of termination of the delinquent Party's services. The Customer acknowledges that the fee set forth on Attachment A may change pursuant to and in accordance with Section IX(C) of the Kitsap 911 Bylaws.

G. <u>Provisions for Use.</u> The Advisory Council on Criminal Justice Services and the Washington State Patrol have requested that all participating communications centers, such as Kitsap 911, which are terminal users of the Washington State Patrol Law Enforcement Data Communications Systems have certain provisions in their regulations and enabling Agreements concerning responsibility for such communication. Therefore, the following is specifically agreed to:

Responsibility. Kitsap 911 shall bear full responsibility for insuring that the law enforcement data communications network and any Criminal History Records Information received by means of such network shall be used solely for the purposes of the administration of the criminal laws or for the purposes enumerated in RCW 43.43.760(3) as now exists or may hereafter be amended. Kitsap 911 shall establish rules and regulations governing access to, security for, and operation of the data communications network for any Criminal Justice Records Information received by means of such network.

H. <u>Duration</u>. This Agreement shall continue unless Kitsap 911 is dissolved or as otherwise provided in this section.

<u>Termination.</u> Except as otherwise specifically provided herein, the Customer may terminate this Agreement upon at least one-hundred and eighty (180) days written notice to Kitsap 911. If the Customer terminates this Agreement, Kitsap 911 is not required to surrender any of its FCC licenses nor is Kitsap 911 obligated to agree to co-license the terminating Party on any of Kitsap 911's licensed frequencies.

I. Insurance/Indemnification – Hold Harmless:

1. The Parties to this Agreement shall maintain during the life of this Agreement such general liability insurance as will provide coverage for claims for damages for personal injuries, including death, as well as for claims for damages to property which may arise directly or indirectly from performance of the work under this Agreement. Policy limits shall be no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability. The Parties shall provide each other a Certificate of Insurance or other appropriate documentation evidencing the coverage as set forth above if requested by a Party.

- 2. <u>Indemnification Clause Customer.</u> The Customer does hereby agree to save harmless and defend Kitsap 911 from all claims and liability due to the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Customer, its agents, and/or employees. Such indemnity shall include, but not be limited to, all out-of-pocket expenses incurred by Kitsap 911, including attorney's fees, in the event Customer fails or refuses to accept the tender of any claims brought against Kitsap 911, the basis for which are negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Customer, its agents, and/or employees.
- 3. <u>Indemnification Clause Kitsap 911.</u> Kitsap 911 does hereby agree to save harmless and defend the Customer from all claims and liability due to the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of Kitsap 911, its agents, and/or employees. Such indemnity shall include, but not be limited to, all out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the Customer, including attorney's fees, in the event Kitsap 911 fails or refuses to accept the tender of any claims brought against the Customer, the basis for which are negligent acts, errors, or omissions of Kitsap 911, its agents, and/or employees.
- 4. The foregoing indemnity is specifically and expressly intended to constitute a waiver of each Party's immunity under Washington's Industrial Insurance Act, Title 51 RCW, as respects the other Party only, and only to the extent necessary to provide the indemnified Party with a full and complete indemnity of claims made by the indemnitor's employees. The Parties acknowledge that these provisions were specifically negotiated and agreed upon by them.
- 5. Kitsap 911 shall comply with all notice and other requirements of RCW 42.56.590, as now in effect and may be amended, in the event of a breach of the security of the system as defined by RCW 42.56.590. Such compliance shall be at the sole expense of Kitsap 911.
- J. <u>Amendments.</u> It is mutually agreed and understood that no alteration or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid, unless made in writing, and signed by the Parties hereto, and that any oral understandings or agreements that are not incorporated herein shall not be binding on either Party.

K. Contacts.

- L. <u>Compliance with All Laws.</u> Kitsap 911 and the Customer shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances applicable to the performance of this Agreement, including without limitation all of those pertaining to wages and hours, confidentiality, disabilities, and discrimination.
- M. Maintenance and Audit of Records. Kitsap 911 and the Customer shall maintain books, records, documents, and other materials relevant to their performance under this Agreement which sufficiently and accurately reflect any and all direct and indirect costs and expenses incurred or paid in the course of performing this Agreement. These records shall be subject to inspection, review, and audit by a Party or its designee, the Washington State Auditor's Office, and authorized federal agencies. Each Party shall retain all such books, records, documents, and other materials as required by the Washington State Records Retention law and policy as established by the Secretary of State of the State of Washington.
- N. <u>Waiver Limited.</u> A waiver of any term or condition of this Agreement must be in writing and signed by the waiving Party. Any express or implied waiver of a term or condition of this Agreement shall apply only to the specific act, occurrence, or omission and shall not constitute a waiver as to any other term or condition or future act, occurrence, or omission.
- O. <u>Default/Dispute Resolution</u>. If either Kitsap 911 or the Customer fails to perform any act or obligation required to be performed by it hereunder, the other Party shall deliver written notice of such failure to the non-performing Party. The non-performing Party shall have thirty (30) days after its receipt of such notice in which to correct its failure to perform the act or obligation at issue, after which time it shall be in default ("Default") under this Agreement. Provided, however, that if the non-performance is of a type that could not reasonably be cured within said thirty (30) day period, the non-performing Party shall not be in Default if it commences cure within said thirty (30) day period and thereafter diligently pursues cure to completion.

In the event a default continues and/or any dispute arises for anything other than non-payment between the Parties, either Party may request in writing that the issue be resolved by mediation. If the Parties are unable to resolve the dispute within ninety (90) days, either Party shall have the right to exercise any or all rights and remedies available to it in law or equity.

- P. <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be governed exclusively by the laws of the State of Washington.
- Q. <u>Venue.</u> The venue for legal action brought by any Party to this Agreement shall be the Superior Court of Kitsap County, Washington.
- R. <u>Assignment.</u> The Parties may not assign any rights or delegate any duties under this Agreement, whether by assignment, subcontract, or other means. Any such attempted assignment or delegation shall be void and shall constitute a material breach of this

Agreement. Provided, however, that this prohibition shall not apply to an assignment pursuant to a consolidation of a Party to this agreement with another Party to this agreement.

- S. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties, and supersedes any and all previous agreements relating to the creation, funding, operation, or maintenance of a regional emergency dispatch and communications center. There are no understandings or agreements between the Parties other than those set forth in this Agreement. No other statement, representation, or promise has been made to induce the Parties to enter into this Agreement.
- T. <u>Invalid Provisions</u>. The invalidity or unenforceability of any particular term or provision of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other term or provision and this Agreement and shall be construed in all respects as if such invalid or unenforceable term or provision was omitted.
- U. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed by the Parties using duplicate counterparts.

DESCRIPTION/BACKGROUND

The Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) has granted the Bainbridge Island Police Department \$7,000 to offset the recent purchase of two "Speed Reader" signs, plus associated power kits and software. The total cost of these two items was \$11,815.69.

The Squeaky Wheels Bicycle Club wishes to give the department an additional approximately \$4,587.30 to pay for all or close to all of the balance of the cost for these units. The members of Squeaky Wheels believe that these speed reader signs will help remind drivers to slow down, keeping the roads safer for bicyclists. This organization first began operating in 1997, was made formal through an interlocal agreement signed in 1999, and the agencies wish to continue demonstrating their acceptance and commitment to the agreement by signing this Memorandum of Understanding to facilitate the growth of Kitsap SAIVS and the Family Justice Center.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

WHEREAS, the following agencies have the power, authority, obligation, and/or responsibility to address issues raised by sexual and domestic violence assault (hereinafter referred to as special assault) in Kitsap County:

- The police departments of the cities of Bainbridge Island, Bremerton, Port Orchard, and Poulsbo;
- Kitsap County Sheriff's Office;
- Kitsap County Prosecutor's Office;
- Kitsap County Clerk's Office;
- Naval Criminal Investigative Service;
- Washington State Department of Social and Health Services, Division of Child and Family Services;
- Kitsap Sexual Assault Center;
- Harrison Hospital;
- YWCA of Kitsap County;
- Naval Family Advocacy Program;
- Kitsap County District Court Probation;
- Kitsap County Domestic Violence Task Force;
- Kitsap Legal Services; and

WHEREAS, the agencies listed above (hereinafter collectively referred to as "special assault agencies" or "agencies") have worked together for a significant period of time to enhance their ability to serve victims of special assault; to arrest, punish and otherwise stop offenders who commit special assault; and to prevent special assault in our community; and

WHEREAS, the agencies listed above have formed an association to further their collaborative efforts to respond to special assaults and refer to their association as Kitsap SAIVS (Special Assault Investigations and Victim's Services), an organization that first began operating as this association in 1997, made formal through an Interlocal Agreement signed in 1999; and

WHEREAS, there exist fundamental areas of agreement among the municipal and private agencies that compromise Kitsap SAIVS; and

WHEREAS, the undersigned's acceptance of and commitment to these areas of agreement, as evidenced by the signing of this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MOU), will facilitate the growth of Kitsap SAIVS and the Family Justice Center, And Whereas it is the intent of the undersigned to create a reference point for our successors, a reminder of what we have done and of what we agree must be done now and in the future if we are to adequately serve the needs of victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.

IT IS NOW, HEREBY, RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1) The undersigned recognize the special character of domestic violence and sexual assault. The majority of domestic violence and sexual assault transactions occur within families, between intimate partners, or within a dating relationship. Moreover, they often involve children as victims, witnesses, or both.
- 2) The undersigned further recognize that because of the special character of domestic violence and sexual assault, investigating these crimes and serving the needs of the victims requires extraordinary effort, skill, and sensitivity.
- 3) The undersigned acknowledge that no one particular governmental or social service agency has the expertise or resources necessary to adequately investigate incidents of domestic violence and sexual assault in Kitsap County and at the same time meet all the needs of the victims and witnesses affected by these special criminal transactions.
- 4) The undersigned recognize that by cooperating to the fullest extent, up to and including co-locating special assault service providers, the quality of investigations will be enhanced and victims and witnesses will be better served and protected.
- 5) The undersigned also recognize that their cooperation will enhance the opportunities for fund raising, from public and private sources, to enhance the ability of Kitsap SAIVS to respond to incidents of special assault.
- 6) The undersigned have reviewed and approved the proposed Budget.
- 7) Therefore, the undersigned agree that:
 - a) They will participate in the Kitsap SAIVS and the Kitsap SAIVS Family Justice Center Program to the greatest extent permitted by law to investigate and prosecute incidents of domestic violence and sexual assault in Kitsap County;
 - b) They will work with Kitsap SAIVS to the fullest extent permitted by law to respect and protect the rights and interest of victims of and witnesses to domestic violence and sexual assault;
 - c) They will work with Kitsap SAIVS to resolve the conflicts that may arise among the participating agencies as they each seek to discharge their separate responsibilities, guided by the overriding interest that they all share in preventing further victimization;
 - d) That they will support Kitsap SAIVS in its efforts to identify and obtain private or grant funding to enhance our collective ability to investigate incidents of domestic violence and sexual assault in Kitsap County and to meet the needs of the victims and witnesses of these special assaults; and
 - e) That under the umbrella of SAIVS, when a Family Justice Center is opened each member agency will perform services as mandated by law and or charter on-site; that is, of the undersigned,
 - Law Enforcement agencies will conduct investigations of reported criminal offenses;
 - Legal Advocates will provide on-site, personal support to victims of sexual assault and domestic violence;
 - Legal Services will provide on and/or off-site legal services to victims

of domestic violence and sexual assault;

- Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners will provide medical forensic examinations and forensic documentation of examinations to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault;
- Child Interviewer will perform specialized forensic interviews of child victims and witnesses;
- Deputy Prosecuting Attorneys and support staff will screen, charge and prosecute criminal violations of State laws as they apply to domestic violence and sexual assault;
- Superior Court clerks will provide public access to the courts and information regarding court proceedings, restraining order applications, and other services as mandated by law;
- DSHS/CPS will provide family services as mandated by law, to children and their families touched by domestic violence and sexual assault; and
- District Court Probation Officers will maintain contact with victims of prosecuted cases to ensure offenders' compliance with probationary requirements and safety of the victim.
- f) That the on-site activities of each agency will be developed and scheduled by that agencies staff, as per the protocol and/or policies of that agency and The Kitsap County Special Assault Investigation Protocol. Staffing and scheduling of individual personnel will be provided by the contributing agency. A Project Manager will coordinate the use of the Family Justice Center by each contributing agency to ensure a cohesive work atmosphere and to maximize the benefit of the shared facility.

In addition, monthly board meetings of Kitsap SAIVS as well as the monthly multidisciplinary case reviews of the Kitsap County Prosecutor's Office SAU (Special Assault Unit) will be held in meeting rooms of the facility.

- g) Commitment of the undersigned to work together to achieve the aforereferenced goals and demonstration of commitment to actively engage in continued strategic planning and performance is evidenced by:
 - Initial creation of Kitsap SAIVS in 1997, formalization of organization by Interlocal Agreement in 1999. Joint drafting and adoption of the Kitsap County Special Assault Investigation Protocol; a guideline establishing and adopting the best practices for each agency in the investigation of sexual assault and domestic violence against adult and child victims, prioritizing assistance and care of victims; adopted for use by all agencies represented by the undersigned, as well as the County's School Districts, and filed with the Washington State Legislature;
 - Drafting and Production of Law Enforcement Field Guide; an outline to assist all line-officers to ensure compliance with best practices as adopted by the County Investigative Protocol;
 - Development and incorporation of the 501(c)(3) not for profit corporation Friends of Kitsap SAIVS, whose mission is to provide financial support to

Kitsap SAIVS; and

• Creation and adoption of the following mission statement:

It is the mission of Kitsap Special Assault Investigations and Victim's Services to have a safer community through the protection of victims and more effective prosecution of criminal offenders.

- h) Specific resources committed to the operation of the center at this time include:
 - Two full-time Law Enforcement Officers, specializing in the investigation of domestic violence and sexual assault criminal violations, one each from both the Bremerton Police Department and Kitsap County Sheriff's Department, and all related support;
 - Rotating and/or part-time placement of Law Enforcement Officers from the Bainbridge Island, Port Orchard and Poulsbo Police Departments and Naval Criminal Investigative Services, including a minimum rotation by Port Orchard of one officer one day each week and by Bainbridge Island of one officer one day every two weeks;
 - Four full-time Deputy Prosecuting Attorneys, specializing in the prosecution of domestic violence and sexual assault crimes;
 - Two full-time legal support staff from the Office of the Kitsap County Prosecuting Attorney;
 - One full-time specialized child interviewer from the Office of the Kitsap County Prosecuting Attorney;
 - One full-time advocate from the Kitsap Sexual Assault Center;
 - One (possibly two) full-time advocates from the YWCA of Kitsap County;
 - Staffing from the Harrison Hospital SANE program, as to be determined:
 - Staffing from DSHS Child Protective Services, as to be determined;
 - One Deputy Clerk from the Office of the Kitsap County Superior Court Clerk;
 - One attorney from Kitsap Legal Services, 24 hours per week and all necessary support and staff including one full-time paralegal and one fulltime case worker:
 - One full-time Project Manager, coordinator; and
 - Facility hours 8:00 a.m. 4:30 p.m.
- 8) This Memorandum of Understanding will take effect on the date executed by two or more special assault agencies.
- 9) The parties may execute this Memorandum of Understanding in multiple counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original and all of which together will constitute only one agreement. Further, delivery of a signed copy of this Agreement via e-mail or facsimile transmission will be considered delivery of an original.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-18

AN ORDINANCE of the City Council of Bainbridge Island, Washington, establishing the role, composition, and duties of the Cultural Funding Advisory Committee and creating a new Chapter 2.43 of the Bainbridge Island Municipal Code.

WHEREAS, the City Council appointed an ad hoc committee ("Committee") to develop a proposal for how the City should distribute funding for cultural element implementation; and

WHEREAS, the Committee met several times with a wide-ranging group of participants and representatives from Arts and Humanities Bainbridge (AHB) and other key stakeholders to solicit input on the goals for funding and suggestions on the process by which funding might be distributed; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approved the Committee's recommendations at its July 11, 2017, meeting; now therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BAINBRIDGE ISLAND, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A new Chapter 2.43 of the Bainbridge Island Municipal Code is hereby adopted in its entirety to read as follows:

Chapter 2.43

CULTURAL FUNDING ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Sections:	
2.43.010	Created – Membership, appointment, term, and compensation.
2.43.020	Vacancies – Removal.
2.43.030	Duties and responsibilities.
2.43.040	Meetings, officers, records, and quorum.

Castiana

2.43.010 Created – Membership, appointment, term, and compensation.

- A. There is created a cultural funding advisory committee for the city, hereinafter called the committee for the purposes of this chapter. The committee shall consist of seven (7) members who shall be appointed by the mayor and confirmed by vote of the city council.
- B. Members shall not be employees or officers of the city or appointed to another City of Bainbridge Island committee, board, or commission, except for specialized committees or task forces of limited duration. Members shall not be staff members, board members, or officers of any organization which will request or receive city funding for cultural funding.

- C. Members of the committee shall serve for a single term to be specified at the time of appointment that coincides with the city's work to review proposals for funding from cultural organizations. A member may be reappointed to a separate, subsequent term, and shall hold office until his or her successor has been deemed qualified and been appointed. No member shall serve more than three (3) consecutive terms unless the city council determines that special expertise is required, or there are no other qualified applicants.
- D. Members shall serve without compensation.
- E. Members shall sign a conflict of interest statement in accordance with the city's ethics program upon appointment and any reappointment.

2.43.020 Vacancies – Removal.

Members may be removed upon a majority vote of the city council. In the event of a vacancy, the mayor, subject to confirmation of the city council, shall make an appointment to fill the unexpired portion of the term of the vacated position in accordance with the city's appointment cycle. Unexcused absences by any member from three consecutive meetings shall constitute grounds for removal.

2.43.030 Duties and Responsibilities.

The cultural funding advisory committee, working in collaboration with the city, shall develop funding recommendations for consideration by the city council. The committee's recommendation should meet any requirements or guidance provided from the city council to the committee including, but not limited to: the total amount of available funds, identified goals and priorities for funding, eligibility requirements, specific parameters such as maximum or minimum award levels, and any other identified guidelines for funding.

2.43.040 Meetings, officers, records, and quorum.

- A. The committee shall meet as necessary to develop its funding recommendation. Meetings shall be open to the public and held in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act (chapter 42.30 RCW).
- B. A majority of the members then serving on the committee shall constitute a quorum.
- C. A city councilmember shall serve as the liaison to the committee and shall also serve as the nonvoting chair of the committee.
- D. For meetings consisting of a majority of the then serving members of the committee, the committee shall provide public notice of the meeting and shall keep a record of its meeting minutes. Minutes of each meeting, including a record of attendance, shall be prepared by the chair and approved and signed at a subsequent meeting. The minutes do not need to reflect the actual discussion, but only the formal actions taken by the committee. The approved meeting minutes shall be posted on the city's website.

E. The city shall provide city email accounts to members and related training on the use of email accounts, including personal computer privacy expectations while serving on the committee.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days from its passage and publication as required by law.

The City and the Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board desire to enter into an Interlocal Agreement (ILA) to continue the Noxious Weed Control Program on Bainbridge Island. INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT ("AGREEMENT") BETWEEN THE CITY OF BAINBRIDGE ISLAND ("CITY") AND THE KITSAP COUNTY NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL BOARD ("BOARD")

WHEREAS, the Bainbridge City Council budgeted funds in 2017 for noxious weed control and desires to extend the program through December 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Board has the expertise to manage a noxious weed control program on Bainbridge Island; and

WHEREAS, the Board is implementing efforts previously conducted by the Kitsap Conservation District which successfully implemented the City's knotweed eradication program by way of a previous interlocal agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Board desire to enter into an agreement to continue the noxious weed control program; and

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, chapter 39.34 RCW, authorizes the parties hereto to enter into this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the City and the Board agree as follows:

1. WORK BY BOARD

The Board shall perform such duties and work as are listed on the Scope of Work, Exhibit A, attached hereto, and made a part hereof by reference. All work funded under this Agreement shall be provided exclusively within the boundaries of incorporated City of Bainbridge Island. The Board shall furnish all services, labor, and related equipment to conduct and complete the work, except as specifically noted otherwise in this Agreement.

2. TERM AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- A. This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by both parties and shall continue in full force until **December 31, 2021**, unless sooner terminated by either party as provided below.
- B. This Agreement may be terminated by either party without cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party. In the event of termination, all finished or unfinished documents, reports, or other material or work of the Board pursuant to this Agreement shall be submitted to the City, and the Board shall be entitled to just and equitable compensation as set forth in Section 3 for any satisfactory work completed prior to the date of termination.

3. PAYMENT

- A. The City shall reimburse the Board only for actual incurred costs upon presentation of a properly executed invoice in a form approved by the City. The sum of the Board's reimbursement requests during the duration of this Agreement shall not exceed \$10,000 each year.
- B. Reimbursement requests from the Board to the City shall not be made more frequently than once a month. The City reserves the right to withhold payments pending timely delivery of progress reports or documents as may be required under this Agreement.
- C. The City shall reimburse the Board within sixty (60) days of receipt of a properly executed Board invoice.
- D. If the work rendered does not meet the requirements of this Agreement, the Board shall correct or modify the work to comply with this Agreement. The City may withhold payment for such work until it meets the requirements of this Agreement.

4. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT

The City Manager of the City, or designee, shall be the City's representative, and shall oversee and approve all work to be performed, coordinate all communications, and review and approve all invoices, under this Agreement.

The Chair of the Board, or his/her designee, shall represent the Board in all matters pertaining to the work and materials to be rendered under this Agreement. All requirements of the City pertaining to the work or materials to be rendered under this Agreement shall be coordinated through the Board's representative.

5. REPORTS ON EXECUTION OF WORK AND PERFORMANCE ANALYSIS

A. Board Year-End Reports

The Board shall produce year-end reports that summarize the work performed and evaluate the performance and results of the work performed pertaining to this Agreement. The year-end reports shall be due by January 15 for the previous year and shall include, but not be limited to, the following information:

- 1) A description of work performed during the period and progress made to date, including monitoring data or performance indicators that reflect the effectiveness of the program elements as set forth in Attachment A Scope of Work.
- 2) The status of the annual work plan.
- 3) A description of any adverse conditions that have affected the program objectives and/or time schedules, and actions taken to resolve these issues.

4) A summary of major accomplishments realized during the year. This report shall include, but not be limited to, photographs, slides, and any other graphics that would enhance the content and/or appearance of the report.

B. City Performance Analysis

The City will review invoices submitted by the Board pursuant to Section 3. The City will also review year-end reports summarizing the work performed and evaluating the performance and results of the work performed. If requested by the Board, the City will provide feedback to the Board regarding work.

6. INSPECTION AND AUDIT

The Board shall maintain all books, records, documents, and other evidence pertaining to the costs and expenses allowable under this Agreement in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices. All such books and records required to be maintained by this Agreement shall be subject to inspection and audit by representatives of the City and/or the Washington State Auditor at all reasonable times, and the Board shall afford the proper facilities for such inspection and audit. Representatives of the City and/or the Washington State Auditor may copy such books, accounts, and records if necessary to conduct or document an audit. The Board shall preserve and make available all such books of account and records for a period of three (3) years after final payment under this Agreement. In the event that any audit or inspection identifies any discrepancy in such financial records, the Board shall provide the City with appropriate clarification and/or financial adjustments within thirty (30) calendar days of notification of the discrepancy.

7. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

- A. The Board and the City understand and expressly agree that the Board is an independent contractor in the performance of each and every part of this Agreement. The Board expressly represents, warrants, and agrees that its status as an independent contractor in the performance of the work and services required under this Agreement is consistent with and meets the six-part independent contractor test set forth in RCW 51.08.195. The Board, as an independent contractor, assumes the entire responsibility for carrying out and accomplishing the work required under this Agreement. The Board shall make no claim of City employment nor shall the Board claim any related employment benefits, social security, and/or retirement benefits.
- B. The Board shall be solely responsible for paying all taxes, deductions, and assessments, including but not limited to federal income tax, FICA, social security tax, assessments for unemployment and industrial injury, and other deductions from income which may be required by law or assessed against either party as a result of this Agreement. In the event the City is assessed a tax or assessment as a result of this Agreement, the Board shall pay the same before it becomes due.
- C. The City may, during the term of this Agreement, engage other independent contractors to perform the same or similar work that the Board performs hereunder.

8. NONDISCRIMINATION AND COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

- A. The Board agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment or any other person in the performance of this Agreement because of race, creed, color, national origin, marital status, sex, sexual orientation, age, disability, or other circumstance prohibited by federal, state, or local law or ordinance, except for a bona fide occupational qualification.
- B. The Board shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work to be done under this Agreement.
- C. Violation of this Section 8 shall be a material breach of this Agreement and grounds for cancellation, termination or suspension by the City, in whole or in part, and may result in ineligibility for further work for the City.

9. HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION

- A. The Board shall defend, indemnify, and hold the City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers harmless from any and all claims, injuries, damages, losses, or suits including attorney fees, arising out of or resulting from the acts, errors, or omissions of the Board in performance of this Agreement, except for injuries and damages caused by the sole negligence of the City.
- B. Should a court of competent jurisdiction determine that this Agreement is subject to RCW 4.24.115, then, in the event of liability for damages arising out of bodily injury to persons or damages to property caused by or resulting from the concurrent negligence of the Board and the City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers, the Board's liability, including the duty and cost to defend, hereunder shall be only to the extent of the Board's negligence. It is further specifically and expressly understood that the indemnification provided herein constitutes the Board's waiver of immunity under Industrial Insurance, Title 51 RCW, solely for the purposes of this indemnification. This waiver has been mutually negotiated by the parties. The provisions of this section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- C. The City's inspection or acceptance of any of the Board's work when completed shall not be grounds to void, nullify, and/or invalidate any of these covenants of indemnification.
- D. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to create a liability or a right of indemnification in any third party.

10. INSURANCE

The Board shall maintain insurance as follows:

- [X] Commercial General Liability as described in Exhibit B.
- [X] Automobile Liability as described in Exhibit B.
- [X] Workers' Compensation as described in Attachment B.

11. SUBLETTING OR ASSIGNING CONTRACT

The Board may subcontract noxious weed control and education/outreach with the prior written consent of the City. In the event that such prior written consent to an assignment is granted, then the assignee shall assume all duties, obligations, and liabilities of the Board as stated herein.

12. EXTENT OF AGREEMENT/MODIFICATION

This Agreement, together with attachments or addenda, represents the entire and integrated Agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either written or oral. This Agreement may be amended, modified, or added to only by written instrument properly signed by both parties.

13. SEVERABILITY

- A. If a court of competent jurisdiction holds any part, term, or provision of this Agreement to be illegal or invalid, in whole or in part, the validity of the remaining provisions shall not be affected, and the parties' rights and obligations shall be construed and enforced as if the Agreement did not contain the particular provision held to be invalid.
- B. If any provision of this Agreement is in direct conflict with any statutory provision of the State of Washington, that provision which may conflict shall be deemed inoperative and null and void insofar as it may conflict, and shall be deemed modified to conform to such statutory provision.

14. FAIR MEANING

The terms of this Agreement shall be given their fair meaning and shall not be construed in favor of or against either party hereto because of authorship. This Agreement shall be deemed to have been drafted by both of the parties.

15. NONWAIVER

A waiver by either party hereto of a breach by the other party hereto of any covenant or condition of this Agreement shall not impair the right of the party not in default to avail itself of any subsequent breach thereof. Leniency, delay, or failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of any agreement, covenant, or condition of this Agreement, or to exercise any right herein given in any one or more instances, shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of any such agreement, covenant, condition or right.

16. NOTICES

Unless stated otherwise herein, all notices and demands shall be in writing and sent or hand-delivered to the parties at their addresses as follows:

or to such addresses as the parties may hereafter designate in writing. Notices and/or demands shall be sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, or hand-delivered. Such notices shall be deemed effective when mailed or hand-delivered at the addresses specified above.

17. SURVIVAL

Any provision of this Agreement which imposes an obligation after termination or expiration of this Agreement shall survive the term or expiration of this Agreement and shall be binding on the parties to this Agreement.

18. GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington.

19. VENUE

The venue for any action to enforce or interpret this Agreement shall lie in the Superior Court of Washington for Kitsap County, Washington.

20. COUNTERPARTS

This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same Agreement.

EXHIBIT A

SCOPE OF WORK

Under the terms of this Agreement, the Board and/or Board staff agree(s) to do the following work:

- A. Recruit and train weed inspectors and support staff for the purpose of carrying out the mandates of chapter 17.10 RCW;
- B. Coordinate and implement Integrated Pest Management strategies on all lands under the jurisdiction of the City for the control of Designated Class A and B noxious weeds as defined in chapter 16.750 WAC;
- C. Provide information and recommendations to assist landowners in their efforts to comply with chapter 17.10 RCW;
- D. Keep a weekly log of noxious weed inspections and landowner contacts, which logs shall be provided to the City with the year-end report and shall include:
 - 1) Detailed logs of GPS locations of noxious weeds; and
 - 2) GPS information regarding such weed inspections and landowner contacts.
- E. Be responsible for the Control of all Class A and B designated noxious weeds (as listed in chapter 16.750 WAC) within the City limits;
- F. Keep detailed logs of control procedures.
- G. Provide staff to assist with landowner complaints.
- H. Pay for all weed inspector wages.
- I. Produce a year-end report summarizing the work performed and evaluating the performance and results of the work performed pertaining to this Agreement by January 15 for the previous year, as specified in Section 5.

ATTACHMENT B INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

A. Insurance Term

The Board shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Agreement insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damage to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Board, its agents, representatives, or employees.

B. No Limitation

The Board's maintenance of insurance as required by the Agreement shall not be construed to limit the liability of the Board to the coverage provided by such insurance, or otherwise limit the City's recourse to any remedy available at law or in equity.

C. Minimum Scope of Insurance

The Board shall obtain insurance of the types and coverage described below:

- 1. <u>Automobile Liability</u> insurance covering all owned, non-owned, hired, and leased vehicles. Coverage shall be written on Insurance Services Office (ISO) form CA 00 01 or a substitute form providing equivalent liability coverage.
- 2. Commercial General Liability insurance shall be at least as broad as ISO occurrence form CG 00 01 and shall cover liability arising from premises, operations, stop-gap liability, independent contractors, and personal injury and advertising injury. The City shall be named as an additional insured under the Board's Commercial General Liability insurance policy with respect to the work performed for the City using an additional insured endorsement at least as broad as ISO CG 20 26.
- 3. <u>Workers' Compensation</u> coverage as required by the Industrial Insurance laws of the State of Washington.

D. Minimum Amounts of Insurance

The Board shall maintain the following insurance limits:

- 1. <u>Automobile Liability</u> insurance with a minimum combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage of \$1,000,000 per accident.
- 2. <u>Commercial General Liability</u> insurance shall be written with limits no less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence, \$2,000,000 general aggregate.

E. Other Insurance Provision

The Board's Automobile Liability and Commercial General Liability insurance policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, that they shall be primary insurance as respect the City. Any insurance, self-insurance, or self-insured pool coverage maintained by the City shall be excess of the Board's insurance and shall not contribute with it

F. Acceptability of Insurers

Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best rating of not less than A:VII.

G. Verification of Coverage

Before commencing work and services, the Board shall provide to the person identified in Section 16 of the Agreement a Certificate of Insurance evidencing the required insurance. The Board shall furnish the City with original certificates and a copy of the amendatory endorsements, including but not necessarily limited to the additional insured endorsement, evidencing the insurance requirements of the Board before commencement of the work. The City reserves the right to request and receive a certified copy of all required insurance policies.

H. Notice of Cancellation

The Board shall provide the City with written notice of any policy cancellation within two business days of their receipt of such notice.

I. Failure to Maintain Insurance

Failure on the part of the Board to maintain the insurance as required shall constitute a material breach of contract, upon which the City may, after giving five (5) business days' notice to the Board to correct the breach, immediately terminate this Agreement or, at its discretion, procure or renew such insurance and pay any and all premiums in connection therewith, with any sums so expended to be repaid to the City on demand, or at the sole discretion of the City, offset against funds due the Board from the City.

J. City Full Availability of Board Limits

If the Board maintains higher insurance limits than the minimums shown above, the City shall be insured for the full available limits of Commercial General and Excess or Umbrella liability maintained by the Board, irrespective of whether such limits maintained by the Board are greater than those required by this Agreement or whether any certificate of insurance furnished to the City evidences limits of liability lower than those maintained by the Board.

RE: Use of Herbicides on City Owned Property and Right-of-Ways

Issue:

The Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board has identified many noxious weeds on both public and private lands within the City. While private land owners may utilize herbicides to control and eradicate noxious weeds, the City Council approved Ordinance 2003-15 on May 14, 2003, adopting a new Chapter 16.30 BIMC, Pest Management and Pesticide Use, which highly regulates herbicide use on public lands.

However, BIMC 16.30.040 (Emergency Procedures) authorizes the City Council to allow use of herbicides when the Director of Public Works has determined that an emergency situation exists where there is a serious threat to public safety, health, or the environment, and that the proposed use is a last resort after less toxic remedies have been tried without satisfactory result. The purpose of this memo is to seek authority from the City Council for the Noxious Weed Control Board to use herbicides to control noxious weeds.

The Nature of the Problem, Reasons for the Declared Emergency, and the Need for the Use of Herbicides:

The noxious weeds identified by the Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board include class A noxious weeds such as Hogweed and class B noxious weeds such as Knotweed, Hemlock, Loosestrife, and Yellow Archangel. The attached map shows the approximate location of areas where noxious weeds have been identified by the Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board staff. As the map indicates, noxious weeds are prevalent throughout Bainbridge Island, both on private lands and along public right-of-way.

The reason for the declared emergency is because noxious weeds, if they are left uncontrolled, quickly outcompete native plants and can cause serious ecological impacts, including loss of stream and wildlife habitat and increased erosion. Multiple research studies and county programs have shown many noxious weeds cannot be successfully controlled by mechanical means. Based on discussions with Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board staff, other methods have been tried on Bainbridge Island such as manual cutting and bagging of the plants. These methods of control have had limited effect because they cannot keep pace with the rate of spread and regrowth of particular noxious weeds.

The proposed herbicide use would be limited to areas where noxious weed control cannot be accomplished through hand or mechanical removal. Based on previous herbicide use by Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board staff, the amount of herbicides used has been well under 2 gallons of any one formulation, and most of the formulations have 3-4% of the active ingredient. The products that the Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board is requesting to use could include Garlon 3A, Capstone, or Aquamaster (Rodeo). Copies of the material safety data sheets are attached.

Description of Specific Active Ingredients that Could Possibly be Used:

Based on the manufacturer's website, the soil half-life for the proposed herbicides averages from 30-45 days. The herbicides will be targeted at specific noxious weeds using either foliar spray or direct injection, so there will be minimal effect on non-target plants and minimal risk of exposure to humans. Use of the products is specifically regulated by the Washington State Department of Agriculture. Applications will be done by a licensed applicator from the County's Noxious Weed Control Program. All products, when used according to the manufacturer's instructions, pose limited environmental and human hazards.

Application:

Proposed dates

Dates of application depend on the method to be used, with earlier summer application appropriate for foliar spray and late summer/early fall applications more appropriate for injection. Herbicide application dates will be chosen consistent with best management practices (BMP's) for most effective results. Most noxious weeds have BMP's that are approved by the State Noxious Weed Control Board, the Nature Conservancy, and other reputable natural resource programs.

Method of application

The proposed method of application will include direct injection and targeted foliar spray. Application will be in accordance to the manufacturer's instructions in order to minimize non-target effects on the environment and to minimize human exposure. Other methods may be used according to an assessment of the effectiveness of current practices and best available science.

Notification of posting

Notification will be done in accordance with BIMC 16.30.060 (Public Notification). Additional outreach will be coordinated through the City's Communications Manager. Outreach will include a press release, information in the City Manager's newsletter, information posted on the City's website, and through social media targeting interested groups on Bainbridge Island such as Weed Warriors.

Steps to minimize risk

All herbicide applications will be done according to the manufacturer's directions by licensed professionals to minimize any non-target effects on the environment and to minimize human exposure.

Evaluation of Alternatives:

According to The Nature Conservancy and the Washington State Department of Agriculture, attempts to control most noxious weeds using only mechanical methods have been unsuccessful (except in small patches with intensive mechanical methods). This is consistent with the County Noxious Weed Control Board staff's experience on Bainbridge Island, which is why they are requesting the judicious use of herbicides for particular areas and on particular noxious weeds. An integrated approach that uses best management practices, including mechanical and chemical methods to control highly invasive weeds, is the best approach for noxious weeds on Bainbridge Island. Mechanical controls along rights-of-way are only practical to temporarily prevent encroachment into the roadway.

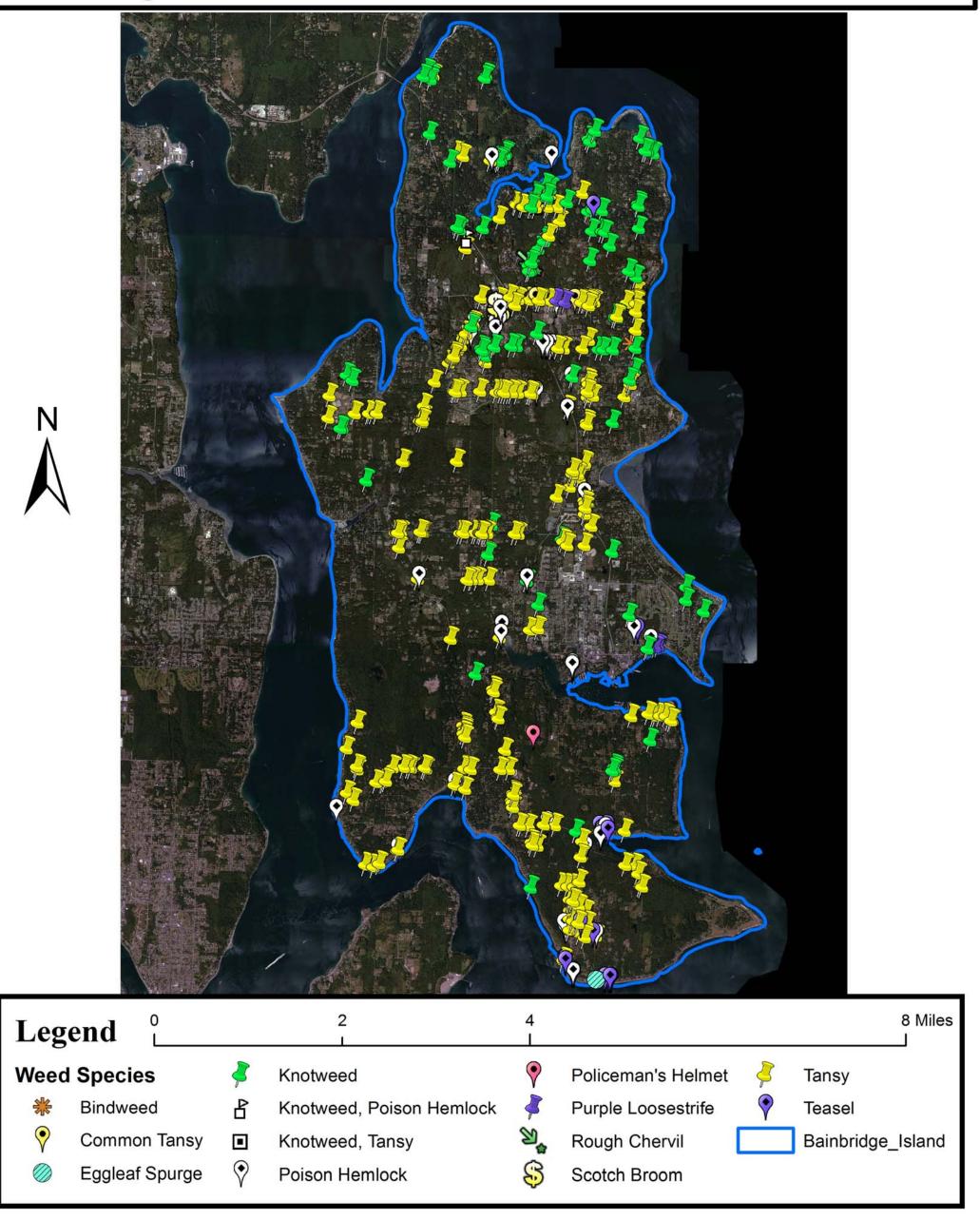
Legal requirements:

All applications will be done in accordance with local, state, and federal laws. According to chapter 17.10 RCW and chapter 16-750 WAC, state law requires noxious weed control.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Bainbridge Island City Council consider approving the limited use of herbicides on City-owned property to coincide with the terms of the interlocal agreement between the City and the Kitsap County Noxious Weed Control Board. At the conclusion of the interlocal agreement, the Director of Public Works shall prepare a report to the City Council regarding the effectiveness and results of the procedures, and the continued need and appropriateness of herbicide use on public property.
